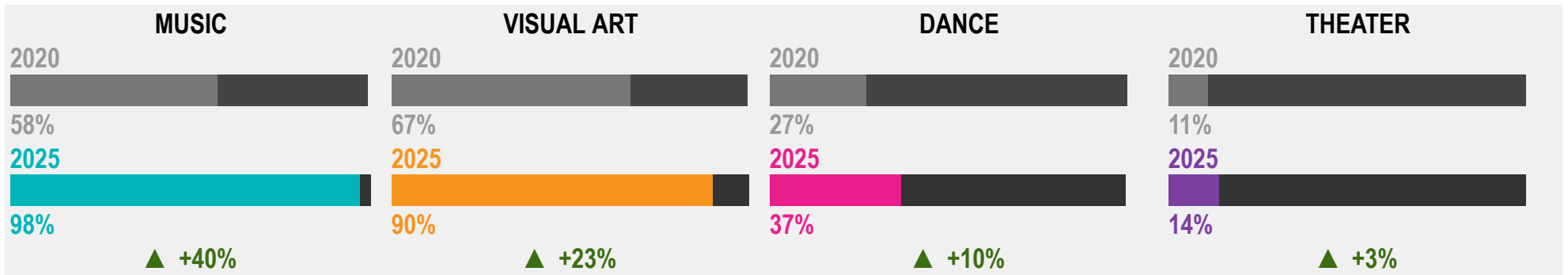


WITH ACCESS TO ARTS EDUCATION STUDENTS ARE:



SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL SKILLS Arts education builds *focus, critical thinking & collaboration* in young people
LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT *Higher language gains* with arts access — supporting Newark's multilingual learners.
BETTER SCHOOL EXPERIENCE Experiencing and creating art *stimulates expression, critical thinking, and problem-solving.*
